SIDESCOMBE, or Sidlescombe, is a parish 3 miles north-east of Battle, in Staple and Battle Hundreds, Hastings rape, with 1,530 acres, and a population of 638, assessed at £2,740. The benefice is a rectory, value £267 per annum, and in the patronage of the Lord Chancellor. Here the Knights Templars had a preceptory. **WHATLINGTON** is a parish 2 miles north of Battle on the river Brode, and the high road from Rochester to Battle, in Battle Hundred and Union. Hastings rape with 1,600 acres, and a population in 1841 of 279, assessed to the Income Tax in 1842 at £1,378. The benefice is a rectory, value £160 per annum, in the patronage of the Countess of Plymouth.
