ESCC can only introduce about 6 of their 200 programmed traffic calming measures each year because of lack of funds. It is suggested by the Area Highway Manager that "if a speed limit is to be lowered to a level below that at which most motorists would wish to drive then it is essential that the limit is enforced by some form of traffic calming measures." He also mentions that the proposed changes to the Traffic Police will result in far less speed enforcement and engineering measures will therefore be essential to decrease average speeds. A dramatic increase in funding is required.</p> <p>Ch.InspBM says "It is hoped by the District Commander that routine speed enforcement will be devolved down to him and that in due course suitably trained volunteers will be able to use speed enforcement".</p>
