When I was a child, and my parents were entertaining their friends and their conversation occasionally became for 'adults only', my father would remind them of my presence by saying 'Brooks of Sheffield' is present. I never heard the origin of the term, but it has remained in my memory.

I think many of us who are parents or grandparents, should remind ourselves that there are times and places for adult remarks and judgements, and that frequently these should not be made when children or even young people are about. Are we careful enough when discussing our friends or neighbours, or when giving our views on some of the outrageous goings-on we have read in the newspapers? Are we selective enough about our choice of newspapers and magazines? Are some of the reports and articles suitable for young impressionable minds? - and what about our choice of Television programmes?

If our standards of selection and judgement are casual or even low, we cannot expect our children's standards to be high. After all, most children are imitators of their elders. This is equally true when it comes to religious observance and worship. If we, adults, adopt a 'couldn't care less attitude' where God and the Things of God are concerned, can we really expect anything different from our children. We are indeed responsible for our children in every way.

Over the years, we have seen the gradual erosion of nearly all standards of conduct in society at large. Let us try to raise our standards and keep them high, not only for ourselves and our society, but also for our children and grandchildren.
